12" Block



Fabrics and Cutting



Light - A
Off White
Tone-on-Tone

Cut four of Template **A**, with short side on fold, add 1/4" seam allowance to other sides.



Medium - B

Cut 1 4 3/4" square



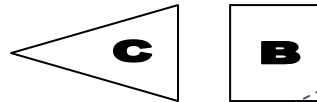
Stripe - C

Cut four of Template **C**, add 1/4" seam allowance, from striped fabric (easiest method) or it can be pieced from small scraps called strings or irregular shaped pieces sewed together crazy fashion. Stripes or seams should run parallel to the base of the triangle.

Directions: (All seams are 1/4")

Step 1

Sew the four **C** pieces, one at a time to each side of piece **B**. Leave 1/4" open at the start and finish of each seam. This will allow for easier setting in of piece **A**, which is a gentle Y-seam.



Step 2

Mark a dot 1/4" from either edge at the top of the piece **A** triangles. Sew piece **A** to **B-C**, one on each side in two steps. (You will do these two steps a total of four times.)



Begin at the edge and sew to the dot and backstitch. The seam allowances need to remain free of stitches.

Cut these templates out and check for accuracy.

A is 6" across the base and 3" on the side. **C** is 4 1/4" across the base and the sides are 6 3/4".

NOTE: Add a 1/4" seam allowance when you cut your fabric. (Dashed line)

If you want to draft your templates use a 6" square. Draw a line from the upper left corner to the halfway point on the right side and a second line from the upper left corner to the halfway point on the bottom edge. Connect the two halfway points.

Line up the stripes with the bottom end of the triangle.

Place on fold of fabric

Bring to CCQ Program meeting on April 13, 2010.
